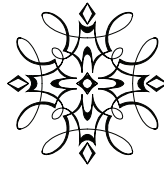

The Friar's Nook

As we move into August, we're trying to get back to some normalcy in the church. On the first weekend, we welcome those in the RCIA into the church. This normally happens at the Easter vigil, which runs late into Saturday night before Easter. But doing it on a Sunday day in a Mass that's live-streamed means that many more people will be able to be part of these sacraments. On the following weekends, we will celebrate some first Communion. This will reduce the number of children who will need to receive first Communion so that in the fall we should be able to schedule a Mass that will hold the rest of the families in the church. We are grateful for those families who have agreed to have their children receive communion at the upcoming Sunday Masses and we're glad to welcome these children into the fullness of participation in the Mass. We could do these sacraments apart from Sunday Mass, but I really think it's a good idea to show the parish that life is continuing and that we continue to grow even in the midst of this pandemic. Especially, that we're not alone.

The diocese was suggesting that we hold off on the sacraments until next year, but for the children who have done their preparation, I don't want them to have to wait. So, we're progressing with First Communion, and doing baptisms privately on Saturdays, which is less than the ideal but is what we need to do for now. As far as Confirmation goes, we'll see how things work out this fall, and hopefully find a time when we can accommodate everyone in the church.

We had a webinar with the Chancery this week. They had done a study on the churches as to how well the opening has gone. For most of them it has gone rather well. The numbers of people attending Masses are still low across the diocese but that is as to be expected. Again, there was great thanks to all those who have volunteered to help out with opening the churches and the recognition that without these volunteers, we would not be able to be open for Mass at all! There was some discussion about receiving communion on the tongue and talk of some parishes that might be doing it. The Cardinal responded that we are not ready to go back to communion on the tongue yet. Based on medical advice the chances of spreading the coronavirus is much higher when involved with reception of communion on the tongue and he, as well as the rest of the bishops in Canada, is not willing to risk that. He reminds us that both wearing masks and receiving communion in the hand is an act of love for our brothers and sisters, that we are striving to keep them safe and healthy. He thinks it's ridiculous that people think he is trying to lessen respect for the Blessed Sacrament by this.

At our General Council meeting this week, it came up that I may need to go to Assisi for the Friars Visitation and to receive the final vows of one of our students. Since presently European Union is not accepting people from the United States, I am Plan B. While I would love to go to Assisi, I don't relish flying in this time of coronavirus. I'll keep you posted on how this progresses.

Remember that you are continually in our prayers and I can't wait to see you all again. Stay safe and follow the rules that you may stay healthy keep others healthy! I look forward to the day when I can talk to you less than six feet away, shake or hold your hand, and give you a hug.

Today

There are two days in every week about which we should not worry, two days which should be kept free from fears and apprehension. It is not the experience of today that drives people mad- it is remorse or bitterness for something which happened Yesterday, and the dread of what Tomorrow may bring.
