### The Friar's Nook

I'd like to share something with you for your Advent reflection. Recently Pope Francis shared this with bishops at a meeting in Rome. It's called the Beatitudes for Bishops. You might wonder why I'd be sharing something for bishops with the average parishioner. It's because I believe that we are all called to pastoral ministry not just bishops, priests, deacons, but everyone. So, I will share them in the hopes that if you can apply them to your own life and you can pray that the bishops apply them to theirs. I will offer some comment on how to apply these beatitudes into our lives.

- 1. Blessed is the bishop who makes poverty and sharing his lifestyle because with his witness he is building the kingdom of heaven. While it should start at the top, and I think Pope Francis is doing a good job of it, a lifestyle of simplicity and sharing is the call to all Christians. Also, it is quite Franciscan. Life is not about getting as much as we can but sharing as much as we can that we may contribute to the building up of the kingdom of God.
- 2. Blessed is the bishop who does not fear to water his face with tears, so that in them can be mirrored the sorrows of the people, the labors [fatigue] of the priests, [and] who finds in the embrace of the one who suffers the consolation of God. Where did we learn that showing one's feelings and weaknesses is a bad thing? We all have them and those that deny them are in a worse state than the rest of us. While they can be used as weapons against us, we should always trust in God's protection and risk doing the right thing in our lives.
- 3. Blessed is the bishop who considers his ministry a service and not a power, making meekness his strength, giving to all the right of citizenship in his own heart, so as to inhabit the land promised to the meek.

Many people want to be in charge or in control. The only one who is in control is God and we need the humility to recognize that. I once heard some young seminarians saying to each other that they couldn't wait to be ordained and get their own kingdom! It made me shudder. I'll settle for God's kingdom, thank you.

4. Blessed is the bishop who does not close himself in the palaces of government, who does not become a bureaucrat more attentive to statistics than to faces, to procedures than to [people's] stories, who seeks to fight at the side of people for the dream of the justice of God because the Lord, encountered in the silence of daily prayer, will be his nourishment.

There are two things going on here. First of all working with people is a messy business and it can be tempting to retreat into just dealing with things. But Christ became one of us, a person, and not a thing so that we might learn that caring for each other is what it's all about. Second, if we should retreat into prayer. Taking the time to be silent

with the Lord daily allows us to hear what is truly important.

I'll cover the next four beatitudes next week. I hope this gives you something to ponder over the next week.

You are in my thoughts and prayers, and I hope I am in yours!


