The Pastor's Nook

My dear Parishioners,

This Sunday, the Word of God invites us to reflect on a virtue at the very heart of Christian life: humility. Sirach tells us, "Behave humbly, and you will find favor with the Lord" (Sir 3:17). Jesus, in today's Gospel, reminds us: "Everyone who exalts himself will be humbled, and the one who humbles himself will be exalted" (Lk 14:11).

Humility is not weakness, nor is it low self-esteem. It is truth lived out in love - the truth about who we are before God and in relation to others. St. Augustine once said, "It was pride that changed angels into devils; it is humility that makes men as angels."

Likewise, St. Teresa of Calcutta reminds us: "If you are humble, nothing will touch you, neither praise nor disgrace, because you know what you are."

Jesus, the Son of God, clothed Himself in humility - born in a manger, obedient to His parents, washing the feet of His disciples, and ultimately giving His life for us on the Cross. From Mary, too, we learn the beauty of humility. In her Magnificat she proclaims, "He has looked with favor on His lowly servant" (Lk 1:48). Her lowliness opened the way for God's greatness. Humility transforms our daily lives in very practical ways:

- It helps us listen before we speak.
- It allows us to forgive rather than hold grudges.
- It makes us grateful rather than entitled.
- It frees us to serve without seeking recognition.

St. Francis de Sales teaches: "Nothing is so strong as gentleness, and nothing is so gentle as real strength." True humility is strength under the guidance of love.

This week, let us examine our hearts: Why do we do good for others? Is it for recognition, or is it for love? Jesus calls us to invite those who cannot repay us, to love those who cannot love us back, and to serve without seeking reward. Our only motive must be love for God and for our neighbour.

Let us pray together the words of the Church:

"O Jesus, meek and humble of heart, make our hearts like unto Thine."

May we, as a parish family, grow in the humble love of Christ, so that our lives may shine with the joy of the Kingdom and our reward may be eternal life with Him.
