The Pastor's Nook

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

This weekend we join the universal Church in celebrating the Season of Creation (September 1–October 4). It is a time to renew our relationship with our Creator and with all of creation. Pope Francis, in his encyclical Laudato Si', reminded us that the earth is "our common home" and that everything is interconnected. He wrote: "Living our vocation to be protectors of God's handiwork is essential to a life of virtue; it is not an optional or secondary aspect of our Christian experience."

This week's Gospel (Luke 14:25–33) challenges us to ask: What in our lives is a higher priority than our relationship with God? Jesus tells us that unless we place him above all else—our possessions, our plans, even our closest relationships—we cannot be his disciples. That same call extends to how we treat creation. If we cling too tightly to comfort, convenience, or consumerism, we may find ourselves unwilling to carry the crosses of sacrifice that discipleship demands: living more simply, wasting less, caring for the poor who are most affected by environmental damage, and protecting the earth for future generations.

The Catechism teaches that creation is a gift entrusted to our care: "Man's dominion over inanimate and other living beings ... requires a religious respect for the integrity of creation" (CCC 2415). In other words, we cannot truly love God while neglecting the work of his hands.

The saints give us inspiring examples. St. Francis of Assisi, whose feast concludes this Season, saw every creature as brother or sister, praising God through their beauty and purpose. St. John Paul II called ecological care a moral issue, reminding us that respect for life includes the created world that sustains life. St. Hildegard of Bingen described creation as shining with the radiance of God, calling us to live in harmony with the order he has placed within it.

As disciples, we are students of Jesus. He teaches us not only how to love one another but also how to live in right relationship with all of God's creation. Sometimes this feels like a cross: saying "no" to wasteful habits, "yes" to simpler lifestyles, and standing firm when others dismiss these concerns. Yet when we unite these sacrifices with the cross of Christ, we discover a deeper joy and freedom.

Let us pray during this Season of Creation that our parish community may be strengthened to make Christ our highest priority, so that everything we do—including how we treat the earth—flows from our love for him.


<u>Prayer Walk in High Park on</u> Sunday September 21st


