# The Pastor's Nook

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ, this Sunday's readings remind us of a sobering truth: life on earth is fleeting, but eternity is forever. The Prophet Amos warns the complacent rich who ignore the cries of the poor (Amos 6:1a, 4-7). Jesus, in today's Gospel (Luke 16:19-31), paints the unforgettable image of the rich man and Lazarus, showing us that eternal destiny is not measured by wealth, but by love by how we respond to those in need.

The rich man's sin was not his wealth, but his refusal to share it. He failed to recognize Lazarus, who sat daily at his gate, longing for scraps. How often do we too fail to see the "Lazarus" at our doorstep the lonely, the sick, the poor, the marginalized?

St. John Chrysostom once said: "Not to share one's wealth with the poor is to steal from them and to take away their livelihood. It is not our own goods which we hold, but theirs." Our blessings — material or spiritual — are entrusted to us to be multiplied through generosity.

Death is not an end, but an awakening. As St. Augustine reminds us: "God is always trying to give good things to us, but our hands are too full to receive them." When our hands cling tightly to possessions, resentment, or fear, we miss the treasures of God's grace. But when we open them in love and generosity, we find that God fills them beyond measure.

In the second reading, St. Paul exhorts us: "Fight the good fight of faith, take hold of eternal life" (1 Tim 6:12). This is a daily battle — not against others, but against our selfishness, our indifference, and our fear. St. Teresa of Calcutta puts it beautifully: "If you can't feed a hundred people, then feed just one."

Every day, God places before us opportunities to love:

- A neighbor who needs a listening ear.
- A struggling family who could use a meal.
- A parish ministry in need of support.
- A wounded friend who longs for forgiveness.

The "good fight of faith" is fought not in grand gestures, but in these small, daily acts of love. As St. Thérèse of Lisieux teaches: "Remember that nothing is small in the eyes of God. Do all that you do with love."

Let us not miss the chance to make "hay while the sun shines." For as Christ promises, those who mourn, serve, and love now will be comforted in eternity (Mt 5:4).

May we open our eyes to see Christ in every Lazarus, open our hands to share what God has entrusted to us, and open our hearts to love without limit.




