Third Sunday of Advent



Gaudete Sunday - Rejoice, for the Lord Is Near.



This Third Sunday of Advent—Gaudete Sunday—the Church pauses our penitential journey to proclaim with gentle insistence: "Rejoice in the Lord always!" (Phil 4:4). The rose candle is lit not as a denial of darkness, but as a sign that the dawn is near, and that joy is not an emotion but a gift of God's saving presence.

In the first reading (Isaiah 35:1-6a, 10), the prophet announces a joy so deep that even the desert bursts into bloom. Why? Because God Himself is coming. "Be strong, fear not! Here is your God... he comes to save you." Joy is born from this truth: we are not abandoned. Christ has ransomed us, lifted us, and chosen to enter our world not to condemn, but to rescue.

Saint Augustine reminds us, "We are an Easter people, and Alleluia is our song." Even in Advent's waiting, we live with the certainty that Christ transforms suffering into blessing. Nothing that wounds us has the final word. As St. John Paul II wrote, "Christ takes up all human suffering and fills it with a new meaning." This is why the Christian can be joyful even in trial. Joy is not the absence of hardship it is the presence of Christ in hardship.

In the second reading (James 5:7-10), we are invited to wait "like a farmer" who trusts the hidden work of God in the soil of our lives. Patience rooted in faith becomes the cradle of joy. As Pope Benedict XVI said, "Hope is the quiet joy of the one who believes in God's promises." When we complain or despair, we risk trying to take God's place. But when we surrender and trust, joy begins to grow small at first, then strong and radiant.

In the Gospel (Matthew 11:2-11), Jesus confirms that the Messiah is recognized by the works that restore life the blind see, the lame walk, the poor hear the Good News. Even John the Baptist, from the darkness of prison, finds reassurance in the light of Christ's actions. So too in our prisons of fear, grief, or uncertainty, Christ sends us signs of His nearness. True joy comes not from favorable circumstances but from recognizing Christ at work in our midst.

Saint Teresa of Calcutta once said, "Joy is a net of love by which we catch souls." When we live joyfully, even in trials, we become instruments of Christ's compassion. Our wounds become ministries. Our sorrows become ways to lift others. Our pain becomes a place where Christ's light breaks through.

Gaudete Sunday reminds us: The joy we taste today is only a foretaste of the joy that awaits us. For "the joy of the Lord is our strength" (Neh 8:10).

Therefore, as we continue our Advent journey:

- Let us carry joy as our lamp.
- Let us wait patiently for the Lord, trusting that He is already at work.
- Let us lift one another up as signs of Christ's coming.
- Let us rejoice-not because life is perfect, but because God is with us, and His love is transforming everything.

May this Gaudete Sunday refresh our spirits, strengthen our hope, and fill our hearts with the joy that will one day be full and everlasting.

Maranatha! Come, Lord Jesus. Come with Your joy.
