Fourth Sunday of Advent – Emmanuel: God Is With Us

Love is the heart of the Fourth Sunday of Advent, and love has a name: Emmanuel God is with us. This is not merely a comforting idea or a seasonal sentiment; it is the very core of our faith. To love is to live with God-with-us. To give love is to give God who dwells within us.

Many of us know the fatigue of loving: loving without being loved back, loving those who wound us, loving when patience runs thin. Yet we never truly run out of love, because God, who is Love itself, never leaves us. As Saint Augustine reminds us, “God loves each of us as if there were only one of us.” When our human love feels empty, God invites us to draw from His inexhaustible love and to love with a supernatural love His own.

This is the miracle of Emmanuel. When we choose to love the unlovable, forgive the unforgiving, and remain faithful in difficult relationships, we become living signs of God’s presence in the world. Saint Teresa of Calcutta beautifully said, “We are not called to be successful, but faithful.” Faithfulness in love is how God continues to make Himself visible today.

The readings of this Sunday deepen this mystery. In Isaiah (7:10–14), God gives King Ahaz a sign not because Ahaz demands it, but because God freely chooses to reveal Himself. The virgin shall conceive, and His name shall be Emmanuel. This teaches us an essential spiritual truth: God acts when we humble ourselves and trust Him. As the Catechism of the Catholic Church teaches, “The Son of God became man so that we might become God” (CCC 460). In Jesus, God does not remain distant He enters our history, our struggles, our relationships.

Saint Bernard of Clairvaux wrote, “The name of Jesus is light, food, and medicine.” Emmanuel is that light and that healing presence. Saint Leo the Great echoes this teaching: “Christian, remember your dignity: you now share in God’s own nature.” Because God is with us, our lives matter, our choices matter, and our cooperation with grace matters.

Saint Paul, in the Letter to the Romans (1:1–7), reminds us that this promise is not an “empty word” but a fulfilled reality. Christ is truly God and truly man, descended from David and revealed as the Son of God in power. And remarkably, Paul tells us that we belong to Him. The Church teaches that through baptism we are incorporated into Christ and share in His mission (CCC 1267). We are no longer spectators we are participants in God’s saving plan.

In the Gospel (Matthew 1:18–24), Joseph teaches us quiet obedience and courageous trust. Without words, he cooperates with God’s plan. Saint John Chrysostom praised Joseph’s faith, saying, “Joseph obeyed without questioning, showing the obedience of faith.” Like Mary and Joseph, God continues to work through ordinary people who are willing to say “yes.”

As Christmas draws near, the Church invites us to renewed vigilance not anxiety, but attentive love. Emmanuel is not only coming; He is already with us. Saint Alphonsus Liguori assures us, “There is no fear in love; perfect love casts out fear.” Our happiness does not depend on how others treat us, but on the unshakable truth that God is with us and loves us unconditionally.

This Advent, let us keep our eyes fixed on Jesus. Let us pray to Emmanuel, sing to Emmanuel, and trust Emmanuel. As Saint John Paul II said, “Do not be afraid. Open wide the doors to Christ.” May we allow ourselves to become instruments like Mary and Joseph through whom God continues to dwell among His people.

Emmanuel is God’s personal Christmas gift to us.
