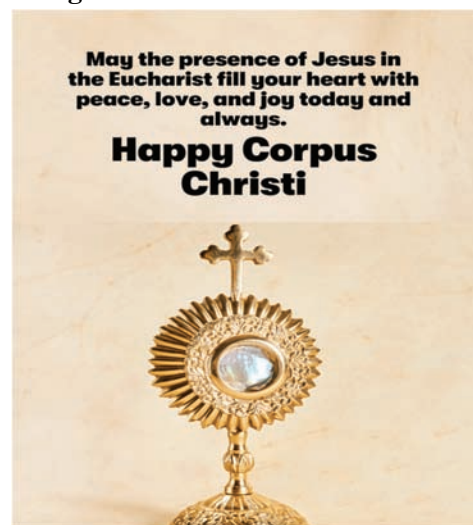

Corpus Christi: The Greatest Treasure of the Church

The Solemnity of Corpus Christi, the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, invites us to renew our faith in the greatest gift Jesus has left to His Church the Holy Eucharist. The Eucharist is not merely a symbol or a sacred reminder of Christ; it is Christ Himself, truly present Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity. At every Mass, the sacrifice of Calvary is made present, and heaven touches earth as the Lord feeds His people with the Bread of Life. The Church teaches that the Eucharist is “the source and summit of the Christian life” (CCC1324). Everything we are and everything we do as Catholics flows from and leads back to the altar of the Lord.

The saints spoke with profound love about this incomparable gift. St. John Vianney said, “If we truly understood the Mass, we would die of joy.” St. Padre Pio called the Mass “infinite, like Jesus,” while St. Teresa of Calcutta reminded us, “When you look at the Crucifix, you understand how much Jesus loved you. When you look at the Holy Eucharist, you understand how much Jesus loves you now.” The Eucharist is the living heart of the Church, the fountain of grace, the strength of the weak, the consolation of the sorrowful, and the food that sustains us on our journey to eternal life.

As Catholics, we are called to approach the Eucharist with profound reverence, devotion, and awe. Every gesture during Mass the sign of the cross, genuflecting before the tabernacle, kneeling in prayer, maintaining a sacred silence, and dressing modestly for worship expresses our faith in the Real Presence of Jesus. These cherished traditions of the Church are not mere customs; they are visible signs of our love and respect for the Lord who dwells among us. In a world that often forgets the sacred, we must be witnesses who honour Christ in the Eucharist with our whole heart, mind, and soul.

The Feast of Corpus Christi also reminds us of the beauty of Eucharistic Adoration and Eucharistic Processions. When we kneel before the Blessed Sacrament, we kneel before the King of Kings. St. Peter Julian Eymard, known as the “Apostle of the Eucharist,” wrote: “The Eucharist is the supreme proof of the love of Jesus.” Let us make frequent visits to the Blessed Sacrament and spend time in silent prayer before our Eucharistic Lord. Every encounter with Jesus in the Eucharist has the power to transform our hearts, strengthen our families, and renew our parish community.

As we celebrate this great feast, let us rekindle our love for Jesus truly present in the Blessed Sacrament. Whenever we receive Holy Communion or come into the presence of the Eucharist, let us pray with faith and devotion: “**O Sacrament Most Holy, O Sacrament Divine, all praise and all thanksgiving be every moment Thine.**” May this beautiful prayer become the constant song of our hearts. Through the intercession of Our Blessed Mother and all the Eucharistic saints, may we grow in reverence for the Holy Mass, deepen our love for the Eucharist, and draw ever closer to Christ, who remains with us until the end of time.
