Getting to Know You . . .

Depending upon how your world works, this is the beginning of summer or the end of the year. We are enjoying the longest days and our thoughts may easily turn to a little renewal.

In the midst of all this, I have landed among you to strive to be a good shepherd of all the souls of the parish. I will take some time to share a little of my life and chapters in ministry that have come before my arrival, and I look forward to hearing about your journeys in faith, and how you see yourselves living out your Christian vocations. Where is God alive and active in daily life?

St. Joan of Arc, as we probably know was a young woman who was treasured but also not understood in her own time. Her canonization occurred centuries after her death. In some ways, her vocation was not complicated. She was an innocent heart who followed her inner voice, striving to discern where the Lord called her and then to be faithful in doing it. In our own time, her life poses certain challenges. Putting on armour and fighting in a world that is so often fighting with itself probably invites a certain determined call to peacemaking, exercising charity in patience. I would say her courage invites us to mature faith, a willingness to do our particular part to support the budding forth of God's Kingdom.

I am in my earliest days here and will spend quite a bit of time listening, getting to know as many of you as I can. While we have some practical challenges with the church's roof and residence, these are things we will work through and come to a sustainable conclusion. I will put priority on developing plans for the roof. I have already had a short Zoom meeting with the architect and will engage our parish committees and communicate with all of you as things move along step-by-step. We do need to make sure that the "envelope" of the church is weathertight.

My place of residence, for the time being, will be St. Peter's Parish at Bloor and Bathurst, so I will be commuting on the subway each morning. It will take me a couple of weeks to get my office and residence situation sorted out, but after that you can expect that I will be around the parish office most of the time. I will also be quite willing to make appointments in the early evening.

No matter what our background or length of time at the parish may be, we each live by our life's story. Each of our stories is sacred, in the sense that they reflect how our conscience and discernment are put into action. I hope to listen well. Over time we will discern ways of building the vitality of the parish community further. My prayer now, for each of you, is that the Holy Spirit help you to use the summer well to be renewed.
